Yazd will become the world's volleyball capital with the presence of stars.


the 26th edition of the Asian Men's Club Championship volleyball competitions from September 18 to 25. This will mark the fifth time that the Islamic Republic of

Iran has hosted this prestigious competition, with Tehran having previously hosted in 2002, 2004, 2013, and 2022. Notably, this year marks the first time that a city other than the capital will host these competitions.

Renowned as the city of Windcatchers and being recognized as the world's first mud-brick city, Yazd holds significance as a medical and cultural hub within Iran. The hosting of these competitions is expected to significantly enhance the city's standing as a tourism destination.

Yazd is famous for its old and traditional neighborhoods featuring mud-brick and mud alleys, comprising markets, mosques, and houses. However, with the participation of volleyball superstars such as Earvin N'Gapeth, Seyed Mohammad Mousavi, Amir Ghafour, and others, Yazd is poised to ascend to the status of a global volleyball capital. It is hoped that the players, technical staff of the participating teams, judges, members of the control committee, and foreign guests attending the tournament will carry back fond memories of their visit to Iran and the city of Yazd to their respective countries. The competition is anticipated to showcase a high level of play and deliver enthralling matches. With unwavering support from the Asian Volleyball Confederation and the Fédération International de Volleyball, Iran has continually upheld its reputation for successfully hosting significant events in the realms of Asian and world volleyball. The hosting of this event in the city of Yazd is being accomplished with the full support of the esteemed governor of the province, the political and sports officials of the province, and the officials of the Ministry of Sports. It is our sincere hope that this event, steered by the honorable minister, will foster valuable and remarkable experiences for the advancement of volleyball in Asia and Iran.











Yazd The World Heritage City

Yazd is known as the world's first city built from raw brick and is considered one of Iran's cultural and medical hubs. The historical texture of this city was registered as a national heritage of Iran on March 6, 2006. Yazd is also famous as the city of windcatchers, the abode of worship, the house of knowledge and action, the city of bicycles, sweets, qanats (ancient underground irrigation systems), frugality, and the city of fire and sun.

Often recognized as the second historical city in the world, Yazd is distinguished by its unique architectural style; however, the grandeur and beauty of Yazd's architecture have always overshadowed other cultural aspects of this province, despite its undeniable benefits.

In the historical texture of Yazd, the houses are built with a distinctive desert architecture. The hallmark of this architectural style includes domes, windcatchers, and cisterns within the homes.

The houses are designed for both winter and summer use, with their unique and attractive rooftops intended for summer gatherings. They feature unique and beautiful courtyards. This historical texture attracts many tourists from around the world to Yazd each year.

The people of Yazd speak Persian, commonly with a Yazdi accent. In Yazd province, some dialectical features are noticeable among different counties. The "Zoroastrians" among themselves communicate in the Pahlavi language (Goruni or Zoroastrian Dari). Yazd County is located in a vast and arid valley between the Shirkoh and Kharang mountains, stretching from 15 degrees and 53 minutes to 40 degrees and 54 minutes east longitude and from 46 degrees and 31 minutes to 15 degrees and 32 minutes north latitude. This county is bordered to the north by the cities of Meybod and Zarch, to the east by the cities of Ardakan and Bafq, to the west by Isfahan province, and to the south by the counties of Taft, Abarkuh, and Mehriz. The average elevation of Yazd County is 1,200 meters above sea level. Located in the central part of the Iranian plateau, Yazd is subject to some of the most unsuitable natural factors affecting the central plateau of Iran. Low rainfall accompanied by severe evaporation, distance from the sea, proximity to a vast and arid salt desert, low relative humidity coupled with high temperatures, are among the factors that have made Yazd one of the driest regions in Iran. Additionally, there are significant fluctuations in temperature in this area. Geographically, the central point of Iran (Markar Clock) is situated in this city.

The most distinctive feature of Yazd is its unique desert architecture. Windcatchers, minarets, and domes are the most prominent aspects of the city's architectural style. In this architectural style, windcatchers are used to capture airflow and cool the interior spaces of the buildings.

The competition in the city of peaceful coexistence of religions, which roots back to the second oldest tree in the world, the Cypress of Abarquh, brings a message of peace and serves as a reminder of the continuity of human life in symbiotic existence.

It is hoped that this message will reach the ears of people worldwide, and that peace and friendship, together with the excitement and spirit of sports competition, echo across the vast expanse of existence in the exclusive stadium of Shahdab Yazd. With a high sense of pride in hosting Yazd and these noble, knowledgeable, and volleyball-loving people, I raise the representation of the ancient continent.

Brief History of Iran's Volleyball

he History of Iran's volleyball dates back to 1920 around 100 years ago when Mr. Mir Mandi VARZANDEH, the great master of sport brought volleyball regulations to Iran. He began teaching it at the DARALMOALEMIN (house of sport teachers). At the first stage, volleyball did not have any special method; it was played in different shapes. Knowhow and tactics of volleyball as its rules did not follow any fundamental rubrics. Every player was playing it by his own private initiative that was attendant by punching the ball. In 1922, the use of translation of foreign magazines into Persian assisted in adopting those rules that were implemented in the other countries. Since 1925, the enthusiasts have garnered more attention to volleyball and in a short time; many people were attracted to this sport. So that the training of volleyball started seriously and continually in three different spots that were Daralmoalemin (House of sport teachers), Shayesteh or Ejtemaeiyon club, and Sport club of Alborz College.

The latter comparing with the other two places had more and better facilities. Thus, most of the youth were going there for practice. After some months of training, the first volleyball match in 1925 took place between two teams of Daralmoalemin and Shayesteh club that created abundant joy. Since the match was new for the people, their presence created high rivalry between both teams; it added a lot of excitement to the match. The match was an introduction for day-to-day expanding of this new sport. Volleyball gradually found its way into the schools and in a short period by graduated teachers from Daralmoalemin expanded to schools and cities round the country. After Tehran, Esfahan was the second city that played a major role in the development of volleyball. The first match of the cities was held between two teams of Esfahan College and Alborz college of Tehran.

Supplying the ball specific for volleyball was one of difficult matters in those days;

players mostly were using the ball of football for playing volleyball. Finally, someone called Ghomshehei made the first ball of volleyball. In 1935, club matches were held in Tehran. DARBAND club crowned the championship. In this




year, some friendly and encouraging matches were hold among women teams of Tehran. The first championship in volleyball simultaneously along with other sport disciplines was performed in 1939. By establishing sport federations in 1985, volleyball and Basketball jointly had a federation up to 1957, in those years matches were hold under the title of clubs championship, free groups, qualification groups, school sport, faculties of different cities and at last the national championship.

During the WWII (World War II), when the Allies occupied Iran, sport contacts especially in volleyball was done with soldiers, it was a new way to get familiar with volleyball of the other countries. At that time, a friendly match was fixed between Iran and Russian Army team in Bandar Anzaly where Iran successfully concluded the match. Translating a book into Persian on volleyball rules in 1954 by Dr. Seyed Ziaeddin SHADMAN was a valuable step taken. He was the contemporary president of the Volleyball and Basketball federation. The translated book was edited by Mr. Kazem RAHBARI, the chief of physical Education of schools in capital city; he was one of the distinguished referees in volleyball and active in some other sport disciplines. His book provided a methodical shape for organizing volleyball matches.

By the end of 1957, volleyball found its independent federation and Mr. Amir Abbas AMIN was nominated as the first president. It was then that membership in World Federation has been proposed and it came true one year after in 1959.

In 1958, for the first time national men's team of PAKISTAN was invited to Tehran to have some friendly matches with national team, club teams and Army team of Iran. The national volleyball senior men's of Iran were then





composed a team for the first time. Some months later. Iran men's national team was dispatched to TOKYO for the Asian volleyball championship of 1958. The team had eight players: Kamal POORHASHEMI, Abdol Mon'em KAMAL, Mohammad Esmaeel ASHTARI, Mohammad SHARIFZADFH, Abbas TEHRANI, Nilahmood ADL. Hossein Ali AMIRI and Siavash FAROKHI.

Noteworthy to add that Mr. Fereydoon SHARIFZADEH who was one of the great coaches of volleyball, basketball and football accompanied them as the head coach, Formerly he had played for TURKEY Galatasaray. This was regarded as the first time volleyball team was participating in an important international event and could finally achieve the second place with glory and pride among the participants. Therefore, silver medal of the first Asian games was brought home as a valuable gift.

After these championship, international activities of Iran volleyball started, some of the prominent ones were dispatching coaches and referees to international courses. inviting men's and women's teams of other countries to Iran, participation of the national team of both gender in official international tournaments and championships such as Asian Games, Asian Championships, World Championship, World Student's Championship, World Military Games, World Championship for the Deaf, World Sitting Volleyball Championship, World Rail Road's Championship, Presidential Cup of TURKEY, Kazakhstan, and Sheikh Rashid of Emirates. In those years, Mr. Ebrahim Nemati was known as the international referee who was selected as a member of FIVB Referee Commission then. Local events such as league championship, called PASARGAD Cup were hold in 1974, 1975, and 1976. In addition, FAJR international championships, premier league, and first division league took place from 1993





-2006. All of them had significant importance resulted in expansion and progress of volleyball.

Volleyball after Islamic Revolution

During the first years of revolution and the imposed Iran-Iraq war. successive changes were made at presidential level of volleyball federation that caused immense alteration in combination of board members. Plans and schedules of volleyball did not employ stable structure. The attempts were mostly made in Public Sports.

Gradually by finishing the Imposed War and organizing the programs and management in sport, the shape of tournaments has changed in terms of quantity, quality, and administration. International contacts revived and volleyball has taken a new step toward a better start.

The international tournaments of Fajr Championship — from 1985 to 1999 — is of valuable events in the Iranian volleyball history that caused the improvement of Iran's volleyball and encouraged the clubs to participate in domestic competitions. Thus, Iranian premier league and league one competitions have founded in their novel way, as it is common elsewhere in the world.

The Story of History

A century after the beginning of the story (1920), Iran has now an incredible history and is at the apex of Asian volleyball as one of the top ten teams of the world. The path that went through decades and passed from the most basic formats of the game and the classic days to finally reach its modern era and recorded successive Asian championships, Asian Games and being among the top teams in the world and the Olympic Games.

Iran is now the champion of the last two Asian Games (2014-2018) and the champion of the three Asian's Championships (2011, 2013, 2019), the 12th team in the world volleyball volleyball ranking and one of the most popular teams of the world.

Volleyball is now among the three most popular sports in Iran (along with football and wrestling) and favors the support of million fans.

The Asian Games

The history of Iran volleyball in the Asian Games dates back to the first edition of the Games in Tokyo in 1958 when Iranian men won silver medal. Iranian women also made their bronze medal debut in 1966 at the Asian Games. In the same games, Iranian men also won bronze medal. But after that, Iran walked away from taking the podium for 36 years, until Iran winning the silver medal once again in Busan 2002 and repeating this position in 2010.

This was the beginning of a new era of Iran volleyball, which experienced its missile growth in international levels and managed to prove its complete superiority by winning the championship title and the gold medal of the last two Asian Games (2014-2018).

The Olympics

Following the new path that has begun, Iran's men have participated in two Olympic Games. The first time Iran volleyball team was in Olympics was 5 years ago in Rio. Iran took the 5th palce on that competitions in it's first presentment. Iran hired Vladimir Alekno for it's Second presence in Olympics and entered the Tokyo 2020 Games





by his Guidance and stands on 9th place among 12 teams. Of the other reason that Iran could gain great success in various world and Asian arenas in youth, Junior, and Senior age groups is to inject the updated science of volleyball to the players by employing such great coaches as: Ivans Bugajenkovs, Utsa Cetkovic, Park Ki-won, Milorad Kijac, Zoran Gajic, Juilo Velasco, Slobodan Kovac, Raul Lozano, Igor Kolakovic, Vladimir Alekno And Behrouz Ataei. Asian & World Chairs taken in AVC & FIVB by the Iranian representatives are of the other honors worth mentioning. Ms. Maryam Hessaby, Mr. Amir Tolouekian and Dr. Homa Abedifar are respectively the three members of FIVB in Communication & Marketing Commission, Events Council Commission and Anti-doping Expert of Medical committee.

Dr. Mahmoud Afshardoust, Mr. Mohammad Shahmiri, Mr. Mehdi Eslami, Mr. Masoud Yazdanpanah, Dr. Gholamreza Norouzi and Mr. Nader Ansari are respectively the six members of AVC in Coaches, Referee, Finance Committees, Events Council, Medical and Beach Volleyball Committees.

Dr. Mohammad Reza Davarzani, the current president of Iran Volleyball Federation is the member of AVC & FIVB Administrative Board and Finance Commission member. He is the first Iranian who could ever get the most important and the highest position in volleyball world.

COMPETITION REGULATIONS

Introduction

These Competition Regulations provide the Team Delegations and AVC Delegation with the obligations and guidelines (as applicable) related to the participation and the technical staging of the Event (and other associated side events).

The following rules of interpretation apply in these Competition Regulations:

- a. The AVC reserves the right to update these Competition Regulations at any time prior to the Event. In the event of any variation of these Competition Regulations, the AVC will promptly notify the stakeholders and share the updated numbered version of these Competition Regulations.
- b. Unless otherwise stated in these Competition Regulations, in the event there is any conflict or ambiguity between any provisions in these Competition Regulations and the FIVB Event Regulations, the latter shall prevail.
- c. Unless the context requires otherwise, a reference to the Event shall mean the AVC Volleyball Challenge, including any and all side events relating to such Event.

1. INFORMATION OF THE ORGANIZER

A. Volleyball Federation of I.R. Iran, affiliated to AVC, has been entrusted with the organization of <u>2024 Asian Men's Club Championship</u> on September 8 – 15, 2024.

2. TEAM ENTRY and THE LIMIT OF PARTICIPATING TEAMS

- 2.1 The number of entry is limited to a maximum of 12 teams in Asian Club
- 2.2 No later than 20 July 2024, each member federation must send its official entry to AVC in order to confirm their intention of the participation.
- 2.3 Late entry not available.
- 2.4 No later than 22 July 2024, AVC will reconfirm the Number of National Entry.
- 2.5 The total of 12 teams in Asian Club will be selected by the followings:

Qualification Pathway for Asian Club

Number of participating teams = 12

- 1) Host 1 team
- 2) 3 teams based on the final standing of the previous edition
- 3) 5 teams from the best ranked team of each zone from previous Asian Club Championship.
 - In case no team from a zone participate in the previous championship, the world ranking will be considered.
- 4) 2 top teams based on FIVB NF world ranking (excluding host country).
- 5) 1 wildcard from the hosting NF

Any remaining vacancies to be filled following the world ranking (3rd ranked national team and so on)

- 2.6 No later than 22 July 2024, AVC will reconfirm the total of participating teams.
- 2.7 Within 8 Aug 2024, all entry teams must send the O-2 form, two (2) personal photos of each member, a team photo, and a sports biography of the team to AVC and to the Organizer.
 - NFs may submit the O-2 form via online or submit by email. Please send a excel form of O-2 as well.
 - AVC will provide the Username and Password to all AVC NFs.
- 2.8 Teams must send the O-2 bis and photo of 3 sets of uniform jersey form to AVC 1 week before the starting date of the competition. A late submission of the O-2 bis form will be sanctioned (US \$500).
- 2.9 AVC will not accept the entry of the national federation who has NOT paid their penalty and/or sanction fees occurred in previous events.
- 2.10 Within 31 July, 2024 all participating teams which confirm their entry forms must deposit US\$ 10,000/event for the partial payment and entry fee to AVC account according to the decision of General Assembly on September 22, 2022 in the Netherlands in order to secure and protect the host of the AVC championship.

3. PARTICIPATING TEAMS and PLAYERS



- 3.1 All AVC official Championships are open to the AVC affiliated federations that fulfill their obligations and financial responsibilities with regard to the FIVB and AVC
- 3.2 One team wildcard from the hosting NF
- 3.3 In Club Championship, two foreign players in each team with a valid International Transfer Certificate are allowed to play on court, but the team may have more than two foreign players listed on the O-2 bis Form.
- 3.4 Teams must send the O-2 bis and photo of 3 sets of uniform jersey which Uniform Publicity Form to AVC 1 week before the starting date of the competition. A late submission of the O-2 bis form will be sanctioned (US \$500).
- 3.5 Change of the players:
 - 3.5.1 In the O-2 Form (Maximum of 20 players)

Teams may request AVC to change up to two players registered on the O-2 Form if it is due to medical reasons (with a proper and valid evidence) until 21 days before the starting day of the competition. This requested change will be subject to the final approval of AVC.

3.5.2 In the O-2bis Form

Teams may replace up to 2 players listed on the submitted O-2bis Form before the competition starts, but must report to the CC member at the Preliminary Inquiry for the approval. In this case, the new player(s) must have been listed on the O-2 Form. No changes will be allowed after the commencement of the General Technical Meeting.

3.6 Neutralized players must have been proven residential status in the country or region of their new nationality for not less than two years (up to the opening day of the championship) from the date of issue of the official document granting the new citizenship.

4. COMPOSITION OF THE TEAM DELEGATION

- 4.1 For senior events, a team can have a maximum 22 team members (14 players + 6 officials + 1 accompanying referee + 1 press with a FIVB press ID or a local press ID with an official letter by NF written in English to confirm his/her identification).
 - 4.1.1 A maximum of 5 officials (head-coach + 4) listed on O-2bis can be chosen by the head-coach to sit on the bench, except for the team manager and press.
 - 4.1.2 A maximum of 14 players and a maximum of 5 officials are allowed to come to the court (FOP area). All other extra team members should move directly to a designated area (team seats), not allowed to stay long on the court with their team.
 - 4.1.3 The team manager can sit in the VIP area when their team plays a match, but NOT allowed to speak out (loudly) to deliver technical comments to the team.
 - 4.1.4 There is NO sitting table, in principle, prepared for a team statistician on the court behind A-board around the court. The team statistician (if any) should go to a designated area and communicate with their team via internet (Wi-Fi) connections.
 - 4.1.5 If a team medical doctor is NOT selected to be sitted on the bench by the head-coach, the team doctor is regarded as an extra team member and thus

- cannot be on the court when an official match protocol starts. The doctor should leave the court and must go to a designated area (team seat).
- 4.1.6 A team can have a maximum of 2 Libero and must designate the Libero(s) during the Preliminary Inquiry.
- 4.1.7 If a Libero is unable to play due to a medical reason (injury or illness) or a sanction (expelled or disqualified), the team (coach or captain) can request a replacement of Libero with a normal player whenever the team needs. Once a normal player is designated as a Libero, this player cannot come back again to become a normal player until the end of competition.
- 4.2 The team officials to be sitted on the bench cannot be changed after General Technical Meeting, except for a medical emergency case, and must keep the same number (or less) of the officials on the bench during all matches.
- 4.3 The number of players on each team must have at least 6 players on the court in the competition. If the team has less than 6 players, the team will not allow to play.
- 4.4 For all AVC championships, each NF must nominate a minimum of three international referees or international candidate referees to AVC per event. The AVC RC will then propose to AVC the name of the referee selected as an accompany referee to attend to the event.
 - 4.4.1 A team is obliged to put at least one female referee who is an international referee or an international candidate referee in the National Entry for a female competition of AVC events.
 - 4.4.2 If there is no accompanying referee (international or candidate), penalties shall be incurred as per Article 19.4
- 4.5 Hotel and Room assignments
- 4.5.1 It is strongly recommended that the host should not have more than two hotels for AVC events. It is much preferred to have only ONE hotel whenever possible.
 - If the host prepares ONE hotel for both AVC officials and Team delegates, the
 host should assign the AVC officials (including referees) in a different building
 or sector or floors. If it is not possible to do so, then at least AVC officials
 should be assigned in the area being as much as apart from team delegations.
 - 2) If the host prepares TWO hotels for the teams, it is strongly recommended that the host should select 2 hotels being close to each other with the same level (at least similar) of facilities and conditions for accommodation, especially for food.
 - 3) AVC officials and referees must stay at the same hotel.
- 4.5.2 The host must prepare a maximum of 4 single rooms and a maximum of 9 doubles for a team, and the assignments of the rooms should be done by the following principles:
 - 1) Team officials: 4 single rooms
 - Team manager, Head-coach, Referee, and Press with ID.
 - If a team press does not present a proper document (ID) during the Preliminary Inquiry, that person is regarded as an extra team member (a late submission of the document is not accepted).
 - Coaching staffs: 2 double rooms for whom sit on the bench (even if there are only 3 coaching staffs, still 2 rooms are assigned)
 - 2) Players: a maximum of 7 double rooms
 - Even if there are only 13 players (odd number), still 7 rooms are assigned.
 - 3) Extra officials (up to 2 people only): 1 double room.

- The host should not charge the cost of hotel more than twice of the partial payment / person / day.
- If the team wants to have single rooms for these extra officials, they should pay extra expenses negotiated with the host and the hotel.
- 4) Other extra team members: the host is NOT responsible for these people.
 - It is up to the pre-arrangement between both parties.

5 DRAWING OF LOTS and COMPETITION SYSTEM

- 5.1 All AVC official competitions will be conducted by the AVC Control Committee under the leadership of the AVC President or his representative.
- 5.2 FIVB, International, and International Candidate referees accompanying with the teams and from the organizing country will officiate in the championship.
- 5.3 The Organizer should strictly follow the AVC competition guidelines and regulations.
- 5.4 The competition system is subject to the exact number of participating teams. AVC will forward to each participating federation a finalized competition system and competition calendar two months before the championship starts.
- 5.5 The drawing of lots will be conducted not less than 1st week of Aug 2024. The special function of drawing of lots can be conducted by the host with approval by AVC.
- 5.6 Within 10 days after the drawing of lots, the Organizer should prepare the timetable for daily matches according to the AVC competition format and submit it to AVC for approval.

6 ORDER OF MATCHES and ORGANIZER'S RIGHTS

- 6.5 The order of matches in the preliminary round is assigned (by Berger table) in accordance with the AVC competition format.
- 6.6 The seeding and grouping of the participating teams will be done in accordance with the results of the previous event based on serpentine system and drawing of lots.
- 6.7 The Organizer has the right to choose one match for each pool in the preliminary round if the pool is composed of not more than 4 teams. In case of 5 or 6 teams with a round robin system, the Organizer has the right to choose two matches.
- 6.8 The Organizer has the right to change the timetable and order of matches for TV broadcasting reasons with a prior approval of AVC Control Committee. Each team must be informed of the timetable changes at least one day before the match date. For Semi-final and Finals, the match schedule shall not be changed.

7. CLASSIFICATION OF TEAMS

According to the decision of AVC BA, the classification of teams in the competition will be considered by the following orders:

7.1 Number of Victories: The teams will be classified in descending order by the number of matches won.



- 7.2 In the case of equal matches won:
 - 7.2.1 The following points will be awarded per match to each team:

Match won 3-0; 3-1	3 points
Match won 3-2	2 points
Match lost 2-3	1 point
Match lost 0-3; 1-3	0 point
Match forfeited	0 point (25-0;25-0;25-0)

- 7.2.2 Set quotient. In the case of equality in the number of match points by two or more teams, they will be classified in descending order by the quotient resulting from the division of the number of all sets won by the number of all sets lost.
- 7.2.3 Points quotient. If the tie persists as per the set quotient (7.2.2) the teams will be classified in descending order by the quotient resulting from the division of all points scored by the total of points lost during all sets.
- 7.2.4 If the tie continues as per the point quotient (7.2.3) between two teams, the priority will be given to the team which won the last match between them. When the tie in point quotient is between three or more teams, a new classification of these teams in the terms of 7.2.1. 7.2.2, and 7.2.3 will be made by taking into consideration of only the matches in which they were opposed to each other.

8. UNIFORMS

- 8.1 The playing uniform must be in conformity with FIVB standards. Each team must have available three sets of playing uniforms of a different color. The players' numbers on the uniform can be from 01-99 and must be the same as on the O-2, O-2bis form. Any improper use of uniform color shall get penalties. Details see Article 19.5.
 - 8.1.1. Socks are a part of uniform. All players must have the same color (and design) on the court.
 - 8.1.2. Undergarments (inner wear) must be the same (similar) color for all players. If a team (and/or a player) requires a special uniform or inner wear due to their religions and cultural norms, the team must report it to the CC chairman during the Preliminary Inquiry for approval.
 - 8.1.3. Compression pads (and protectors) for elbow and knee, neutral colors (black or white) are acceptable, but whichever color is chosen, it must be the same color for all players. If they are not the neutral colors, they are also required to be of the same color as the uniform for all players. No padding is allowed in the forearm compression pads, as it provides advantages to the players' performances.
 - 8.1.4. If a player has ankle bracers or knee protection gears for a medical reason with a different color (i.e., grey or blue), should report it at the Preliminary Inquiry with photos (or to the Jury before the match).
- 8.2 The playing uniforms of the team captain must be presented during the Preliminary Inquiry.



- 8.3 The team officials on the bench, as approved at the Preliminary Inquiry, must confirm to either of the following dress code options (no shorts are allowed):
 - 8.3.1 All to wear their official warming up suit and polo shirt of the same color and style, or
 - 8.3.2 All to wear dress jacket, collared dress shirt, tie and formal slacks of the same color and style, or
 - 8.3.3 All to wear dress jacket, collared dress shirt, tie and formal slacks of the same color and style except the trainer who may wear the official warming up suit and polo shirt.
 - 8.3.4 The penalty for non-compliance of the dress code for team officials on the bench will be that the team officials concerned will not be allowed to sit on the team bench and must leave the competition control area and thus will have no further contact with the team until they respect the approved dress code.
- 8.4 The teams are allowed to have max 300 sq cm. publicity of main sponsor and max 100 sq cm publicity of minor Sponsor in front of the players' uniform and 50 sq cm. publicity of minor sponsor on both shoulders of the players' uniform. Any improper use of uniform color shall get penalties. Details see Article 19.5.
- 8.5 Team accompanying referees must bring their own AVC's refereeing uniform.
- 8.6 Publicity on uniforms
 - 8.6.1 For Club events, the Advertising Approval Certificate and the fee is not required.

9. PRELIMINARY INQUIRY

- 9.1 Team delegations must arrive at least 48 hours before the start of the competition and be available for the Preliminary Inquiry.
- 9.2 Team manager (coach) and doctor must be present at the Preliminary Inquiry and must bring the following documents:
 - O2-bis form (a final list of 12 or 14 players chosen from the O-2 form)
 - Passports of all players (or a valid ID card issued by the government authority for only the hosting team)
 - A valid international transfer certificate (ITC) for foreign player (if any)
 - Players' Transferred Certificates (If any)
 - Health Certificate for all players (M-3)
 - Team Doctor's FIVB Identity Card (recommended)
 - Team Physiotherapist's FIVB Identity Card (recommended)
 - Journalist Accreditation
 - Samples of captain's uniforms (3 colors)
- 9.3 The Preliminary Inquiry will be carried out in accordance with the FIVB General Regulations.
- 9.4 The team must pay the entry fee US\$900 and the partial payment to the Organizer in cash (or confirm if transferred by on-line) during the Preliminary Inquiry. If not, the team shall not be allowed to play in the championship until it is duly paid.

10. GENERAL TECHNICAL MEETING

10.1 Team manager (head coach) and doctors must be present in the General Technical Meeting.

10.2 The General Technical Meeting will be carried out in accordance with the FIVB General Regulations.

11. OFFICIAL VOLLEYBALL RULES and BALLS

- 11.1 The competition shall be played in accordance with the FIVB Rules of the Game in force. All necessary interpretations will be made before the competition during the Refereeing Clinic and the General Technical Meeting.
- 11.2 The referee candidates should get the recognition and credit from AVC Referee Commission when they participate in any AVC championship as a referee.
- 11.3 The Championships will be played with the MIKASA Volleyball V 200W

12. TRAINING

- 12.1 The Organizer must prepare a training schedule in which each team is guaranteed the exclusive use of a training gym for 1.5 hours per day.
- 12.2 Each team will have at least one-hour training on each competition court before their first match.
- 12.3 Training schedule for the teams must consider the time schedule of the Preliminary Inquiry and the General Technical Meeting.

13. PRESS CONFERENCE

The head coach and team captain or the player requested by the press must be available for the press conference immediately after each match.

14. MEDICAL SERVICES and CONTROL

- 14.1 All players are obliged to present their health certificates (M-3 form), issued not more than two months before the competition by the competent authority in their country, which the health of the competitor and the understanding and agreement of the competitor in the FIVB Anti-Doping Rules are clearly stated. This health certificate must be countersigned by the doctor and the competitor who thus both take the responsibility for the validity of such certificate.
- 14.2 The Organizer is obliged to nominate a medical director in charge of all medical affairs during the championship.
- 14.3 Before the event, the medical director appointed by the Organizer must contact with the AVC Secretariat and AVC Medical Delegate in charge of the event to report progression of preparations for the medical affairs including doping control testing. Following items should be included in the report.
 - 14.3.1 Name of the doping control officers (DCO) who should be authorized by World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA).
 - 14.3.2 Name list of doping control team headed by DCO accredited by WADA. The team should be consisted with two (minimum) chaperons and two (minimum) technicians to collect urine samples.



- 14.3.3 Name list of medical support team that should be consisted with sports physicians and other medical doctors, physiotherapists, registered nurses.
- 14.3.4 Name list of designated hospitals and clinics suitable for the event.
- 14.3.5 Photocopy of the contract between the Organizer and WADA Accredited Laboratory.
- 14.4 First aid and medical treatment will be provided by the Organizer under the control of the AVC Control Committee.
- 14.5 Doping Control shall be conducted in accordance with the FIVB Medical Regulations.
 - 14.5.1 The Organizer is obliged to prepare doping control station, adequate number of the equipment, and personnel, according to the FIVB Medical Regulations and WADA Code.
 - 14.5.2 The Organizer must be responsible to carry the collected and sealed samples to designated WADA accredited laboratory within due time according to the AVC requirements.
- 14.6 Referees' medical check and alcohol test will be conducted by the local medical team nominated by the Organizer under control of the AVC Control Committee. The Organizer is obliged to prepare all equipments and official forms generated by the FIVB needed for the medical check according to the FIVB Medical Regulations.
- 14.7 The Organizer is requested to provide appropriate room, forms and equipment for the Medical Delegate Meeting that would be held after the General Technical Meeting or earlier upon request from the AVC Control Committee.
- 14.8 All team delegations are recommended to take out their own liability and medical insurance.

15. FINANCIAL CONDITIONS

- 15.1 Each delegation will take care of the following expenses:
 - 15.1.1 US\$ 900 as a national entry fee.
 - 15.1.2 Deposit 10,000 USD to AVC bank account for NFs who send entry form, if a team not paid the deposit in due time for the event, then the team will be eliminated from Drawing of lots of the championships. In case the team withdraw from the championship 50% of the deposit will be shared the host and AVC.
 - 15.1.3 In case of team withdrawal after Drawing of Lots in any circumstances, 15.1.3.1 The entry fee and the deposit will not be refunded.
 - 15.1.3.2 The penalty fee, according to the Competition Regulations, will still be effective.
 - 15.1.4 Airfares of the team to and from the scheduled international airport.
 - 15.1.5 US\$ 60 per person per day for the partial payment for accommodation with full board. Payment should be made to the Organizer during the Preliminary Inquiry (or a transfer or to AVC).
 - 15.1.6 Penalties incurred as per Article 19.
 - 15.1.7 Full payment of accommodation with full board for extra persons, if any.
 - 15.1.8 Extra luggage charge is to be covered by the team delegation.
 - 15.1.9 Airport pick-up and departure for the whole team only, <u>if any team</u> <u>delegates travel separately</u>, the teams have to manage the transportation by themselves the host can help, but not responsible.
 - 15.1.10 Health Insurance

15.1.11 Any extra expenses not covered in the Organizers' commitments.

- 15.2 The expenses to be covered by the Organizer:
 - 15.2.1 Accommodation with full board for the participating teams.
 - 15.2.2 Accommodation with full board for the AVC Control Committee members, and other AVC officials nominated by AVC (all single rooms).
 - 15.2.3 Internal transport from/to the scheduled international airport, and local transport.
 - 15.2.4 Medical first aid.
 - 15.2.5 Laundry of player's game uniform (<u>competition day only</u>: one pair of socks, shirt and short (women inner wears) worn during the match).
 - 15.2.6 Laundry (2 pieces per day, but no jacket) for AVC officials and international referees during the competition period.
 - 15.2.7 Prepare the demonstrative teams and personnel for theoretical and practical Refereeing Clinics according to the competition calendar.
 - 15.2.8 Production of 19 ad-panels on the court (size: 1m high x 3.4 m long as one ad-panel). The Organizer must be in accordance with the contract of AVC and AVC official sponsors. If not, the Organizer shall be sanctioned or seriously reminded.
 - 15.2.9 If the delegation arrives one day earlier or leaves one day later than the schedule due to the lack of flight availability of the hosting city, the Organizer must not charge any extra costs, but partial payment.
 - 15.2.10Transportation
 - 15.2.10.1. 1 Air Condition Bus for each Team.
 - 15.2.10.2. 6 Mini Vans or Micro Buses for;
 - 2 Mini Vans or Micro Buses for Technical Sub Committee and Referee Sub Committee:
 - 2 Mini Vans or Micro Buses for Referees:
 - 2 Mini Vans or Micro Buses for AVC Officials (VIS Delegate, Medical Delegate, Photographer, Press, and Video Challenge Operators).

In case of 1 competition Gym, it will be reduced from 6 to 3 Mini Vans or Micro Buses.

- 15.2.10.3. 2 Cars for President of Control Committee and Technical Delegate.
- 15.2.10.4 The host should provide a team bus for the use of;

appropriate time or using shuttle bus.

- a) competition,
- b) training,
- c) fitness training,
- d) airport pick-up and departure for the whole team only, if any team delegates travel separately, the teams have to manage the transportation by themselves the host can help, but not responsible e) The transportation for strategic observation of opponent's matches in the venue may be provided by the organizer at the
- 15.2.11 The 4 floor stickers (size 2.8 x 2.8 m. or 2.8 m. in diameter) of AVC sponsors will be on the right side and left side of the 1st referee's chair and behind of the end lines. The other 2 floor stickers (size 6.0 x 1.0 m) will be

on both sides in front of team benches.

- 15.2.12 The host is NOT responsible for team's snacks
- 15.2.13 The host is NOT responsible for extra internet connections (WiFi) or signals in the hotel nor in the venue during the championship.
- 15.2.14 Meals are provided with "international standards (buffet style)" any extra can be done by teams themselves
- 15.2.15 If necessary, in case of COVID-19 outbreak, the tests will be done upon arrival (1st), before the competition day (2nd), during the competition (3rd), and the last test will be performed 72 hours prior to the departure to your country (4th).
- 15.3 AVC will cover the following expenses:
 - 15.3.1 Airfare of the Control Committee members to and from the scheduled International Airport (economy class).
 - 15.3.2 US\$80 per diem, from the arrival day to the departure day of their duties for C/C members.
 - 15.3.3 Per diem US\$ 50 per day for accompanying referees.
 - 15.3.4 Doping test analysis at WADA-Accredited Laboratory.
 - 15.3.5 Any other expenses approved by the AVC Board of Administration.
- 15.4 The revenues of the Organizer:
 - 15.4.1 100% of entry fees
 - 15.4.2 100% of ticket sales
 - 15.4.3 100% of domestic TV rights
 - 15.4.4 AVC Subsidy according to the Organizational Conditions for AVC Volleyball Future Organizers, Section 3 Financial Conditions of the Organizer
 - 15.4.5 100% of merchandising rights
 - 15.4.6 7.5 ad-panels on the court (size: 1 m x 3.4 m) and 2 sticker logos (2.8 m x 2.8m or 2.8 m diameter), on the left side of referee's stand and behind the end line on the right side of referee's stand, with positions to be approved by AVC according to the Organizational Conditions for AVC Volleyball Future Organizers, Section 3 Financial Conditions of the Organizer.
- 15.5 The revenues of AVC
 - 15.5.1 100% of international TV rights
 - 15.5.2 8.5 ad-panels of AVC Sponsor on the court (size: 1 m x 3.4 m), including 3 ad-panels for AVC Official Partner, and 2 sticker logos (2.8 m x 2.8 m or 2.8 m diameter), on the right side of referee's stand and behind the end line on the left side of referee's stand according to Ad-Panels Position and the other 2 floor stickers (size 6.0 m x 1.0 m) will be on both sides in front of team benches.

16. ADVERTISING BOARDS

16.1 The Organizer must strictly follow the guideline for the installation of advertising board as specified by FIVB and AVC.

- 16.2 The Organizer must send the layout of advertising panel and banners inside the competition hall to AVC for approval.
- 16.3 The layout of competition hall must be controlled by AVC Control Committee before and during the championship.
- 16.4 The Organizer should place the advertising boards around the playing area of the main court even if the Organizer does not have sponsors for the competition.

17. DAILY BULLETIN

Copies (e-mail) of a Daily Bulletin will be distributed by the Organizer to the AVC, head coach, all participating teams, referees and AVC Control Committee members, from the day before the start of competition (i.e. at the General Technical Meeting) until the day after competition.

18. VIS-SYSTEM

The Organizer takes care of the results and statistics according to FIVB/AVC VIS-System.

19. SANCTIONS

- 19.1 Negligence in regard to the competition or late forwarding of the team entry and/ or O-2 Form and O-2 bis form: US\$500 fine.
- 19.2 No (or incomplete) forwarding of team and players photos, sports biographies, or payment of entry fee: US\$500 fine.
- 19.3 If the National Federation that made a national entry for the Championship happens to cancel its participation, the penalty will be imposed by AVC:
 - 19.3.1 Seven days or less prior to the opening day of the Championship: US\$20,000.
 - 19.3.2 The National Federation will be invoiced to pay additional US\$10,000 (the amount after the deduction of the deposit from the penalty of US\$20,000).
- 19.4 If there is no accompanying referee included in the participating team, the penalties of US\$2,000(Two Thousand US Dollar only) will be imposed on this team in order for AVC to nominate a neutral referee from nearby country to officiate the championship, except for those NFs who do not have an international referee or referee candidate.
- 19.5 The penalty of US\$500 will be imposed to a team which does NOT wear the assigned uniform colour as indicated on the O-1 Form until the official protocol of the match being started.
- 19.6 If the penalty fee is not paid, the National Federation will be suspended until payment has been made (transit period in one month after the invoice is issued).
- 19.7 The penalty fee should be paid by the National Federation involved to the AVC account.
- 19.8 If a participating team returns back to their home before finishing up all their matches without approval of AVC, this team should be sanctioned US\$2,000.

- 19.9 Players not complying with the Eligibility Rules defined by Article 5 of the FIVB General Regulations for International Competitions or who do not present the Health Certificate (M-3) as required in Article 14.1 of the same Regulations will not be allowed to compete in the championship.
- 19.10 Players who refuse to undergo doping control test will be automatically disqualified. The team concerned will lose the match to its opponent 0-3 (0-25, 0-25, 0-25).
- 19.11 Voluntary forfeit of a team before or during a match entails its exclusion from the Championship with the following consequences:
 - 19.11.1 From the moment the team must cover its own expenses.
 - 19.11.2 Damages and other sanctions may be decided by the AVC Board of Administration. All matches previously played will be declared forfeited 0-3 (0-25, 0-25, 0-25).

20. AWARDS

- 20.1 Trophies shall be awarded by AVC and the Organizer to the teams ranked 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in the Championship.
- 20.2 Trophies for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd winners must be prepared by the Organizer.
- 20.3 Medals shall be prepared by the Organizer, and to be awarded to the players of the teams finishing in 1st, 2nd and 3rd places (18-20 medals per team).
- 20.4 Should the third party (i.e., sponsor) wish to award additional prizes, must have the approval and permission of AVC Control Committee Chairman.
- 20.5 The individual awards shall include: one Most Valuable Player, two Best Outside Spikers, two Best Middle Blockers, one Best Opposite, one Best Setter and one Best Libero. All individual awards shall be chosen within the top 4 teams and awarded by the criteria of the VIS statistical data, with a final decision to be made by the AVC Control Committee. And the MVP may be selected from the winner of the championship. The individual awards must be prepared by the Organizer.

21. COMPLAINTS

- All complaints must be presented in writing by the team manager or head coach to the AVC Control Committee member on duty within 30 minutes after the match.
- 21.2 Complaints about the result of a match must be accompanied by a deposit of US\$300 cash (or the equivalent in local currency) for each complaint.

22. UNFORESEEN ITEMS

Any matters not mentioned in the present Regulations should be referenced to Sports regulations of FIVB/AVC and decided by the CC committee in consultation with AVC.



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
